"A House of Prayer" Foundations Week One Pastor Kris Freeman Sunday, August 4, 2019

Scripture: Isaiah 56:7, Jeremiah 7:11, Matthew 21:13, Mark 11:17

Very few like to use the term "_____" especially in regards to the church.



To call the church and its ______ old-fashioned invokes a cultural battle over the right way and wrong way to be a church in the first place.

Our series *Foundations* is not a look at what the church ______ to be, but what the church ______ be when we apply foundational principles which identify us as followers of Christ and the people of God.

The first of those is _____.

Isaiah 56:7 New Living Translation (NLT)

7 I will bring them to my holy mountain of Jerusalem and will fill them with joy in my house of prayer. I will accept their burnt offerings and sacrifices, because my Temple will be called a house of prayer for all nations.

The phrase "will be called a house of prayer" is used in Isaiah and repeated by Jeremiah and then by Jesus. The latter three uses of the verse were a compare and contrast of what the church as a meeting place (or temple of God) was ______ to be and what it actually had become.

Do you ever feel this way about church? Ask yourself - is there ever a moment on Sundays when I worship in God's house which I ask, "why am I here?"

Jeremiah 7:11 New Living Translation (NLT)

11 Don't you yourselves admit that this Temple, which bears my name, has become a den of thieves? Surely I see all the evil going on there. I, the Lord, have spoken!

Matthew 21:13 New Living Translation (NLT)

13 He said to them, "The Scriptures declare, 'My Temple will be called a house of prayer,' but you have turned it into a den of thieves!"

Mark 11:17 New Living Translation (NLT)

17 He said to them, "The Scriptures declare, 'My Temple will be called a house of prayer for all nations,' but you have turned it into a den of thieves."

Before we summarize why prayer is important in the church and for the church, let's identify a few key principles to help us understand it.

- **1.** The church as a building in scripture, the church as a building took on many different forms before it was actually called the "church" in the English language.
 - **1.** The place where the presence of God is (Abraham's bosom)
 - 2. The tabernacle (an often mobile place which the Ark of the Covenant was placed)
 - 3. The temple (a fixed, constructed meeting place for worship)
 - 4. The room (a place for meeting in homes or varying locations)
 - 5. The church building (a modern constructed place for religious activities)

- 2. The church as a people
 - 1. From the Greek word ekklesia a gathering of people together
 - 2. The body of Christ
 - 3. The bride of Christ (a marriage covenant)
 - 4. A movement
 - 5. A mission

So which ______ is the scripture referring to when it says "my house will be called a house of prayer" - the building or the people?

I think the answer is ______ though the immediate reference could be defined as this:

My house (the place where God's people gather) shall be called a house (the actions and attitude of people) of prayer.

So what is prayer?

The simple definition of prayer is "a solemn request for help or expression of thanks addressed to God or an object of worship." A prayer is a language of communication and it takes on many variations and ______.

What is the purpose of prayer?

- 1. Talk to God (say thanks, make requests, give praise or acknowledgement, seek will)
- 2. Meditate and concentrate (spiritual discipline)
- 3. Worship
- 4. Focus
- 5. Intercede (substitutionary request for someone else)
- 6. Preparation
- 7. Discernment

Now let's discuss what goes wrong and why we lose sight of the purpose of prayer.
